These materials will perform best inside, and in outdoor settings that aren't subjected to prolonged periods of direct sun.

All of the materials should be properly conditioned and hydrated before use.

Design with the shape of the material in mind - allow cascading, weeping, or materials with heavy heads to "hang" naturally in the design instead of forcing them upright .
